WHAT IS AT STAKE IN WORSHIP?

"Everything. That's what's at stake in worship. The urgent, indeed troubling, MESSAGE OF SCRIPTURE (I'm not just making this stuff up © -p.v) is that everything that matters is at stake in worship." Mark Labberton in The Dangerous Act of Worship.

Did you know that 16% of people in the U.S. selfidentify as 'unaffiliated' with any religion? They are either atheist, agnostic or simply **uninterested** in religion. That number is more than double the number who say they were not affiliated with any particular religion as children, so they're not just from unchurched families. They're leaving church. Among the unaffiliated, 31% are under age 30 and 71% are under age 50. Among Americans ages 18-29, one-in-four say they are not currently affiliated with any particular religion. That is an alarming statistic. But, it is also an exciting opportunity for the church today. (Data from the Pew Research Religion and Public Life report. (http://religions.pewforum.org/reports)

These people name many reasons for being uninterested in religion. But, I fear that many of them are **NOT rejecting the triune God and the true faith of Christianity**. That would be sad in

itself. But, I fear that many of those 'unaffiliateds' are rejecting a caricature of the faith; maybe the one portrayed in popular culture; maybe the one loudly, and inaccurately proclaimed in many fundamentalist, literalist churches. I fear they are throwing the baby out with the bathwater. Not because they have carefully studied the faith and rejected it for its lack of merit. But, because the Church, including the Lutheran church, has not done a good job of accurately proclaiming the truth of Jesus and of all of Scripture.

Which is why, what we say and do on Sunday morning in worship is important!

It has been said that "All of life is worship, and our Sunday morning gathering as disciples of Jesus is training for that worship."

As we move into summer, a time when worship attendance is traditionally low, I encourage you to commit to being in worship most Sundays so that your training doesn't fall short; so that the rest of the body of Christ (fellow disciples in training) who need you there aren't left struggling to train without you (we're each a vital part of the body together!); so that the world, which has such a distorted view of Jesus and God's call on our lives, will be renewed and even transformed by our ongoing worship in the rest of our lives, everywhere we go and in all we do.

In this time of traditionally low involvement in church activities, **you are invited to participate** in some new things being offered this summer:

Prayer group – learning about prayer and praying together

Faith 101 – learning about what the Christian faith is REALLY about by clearing up some misconceptions.

Sign-ups will be available in the Parish Hall for these two groups, or call the office and let us know you're interested and a time that will work for you. I'd like to offer **each group during the week, once during the day and one evening a week**. Faith 101 can also be a Sunday morning group if there is interest.

Are there other things you'd like to participate in during these longer days??? (How

about getting together to talk about faith topics, whatever is on your mind, over coffee/beer/wine?) Let me know what you're interested in and we'll make it happen!

To get your imagination going here are some of the outrageous things the Bible actually does say:

Love your enemies. Matthew 5:44 (Not just friends, or those who annoy me, but enemies?)

What does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness and to walk humbly with your God. (Micah 6:8) (Really,** it's that simple? And that difficult?)

Lay down your life. Take up your cross and follow me. Luke 9:23 para. (My whole life? And a cross? Instrument of torture and death, really?)

Do not worship any god except me. (and gods include money, family, health, status, sports, etc.)

For God so loved **the world**... John 3:16 *(the whole world! Not just Christians!)*

"Lord, when did we fail to help you when you were hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or sick or in jail?" "Whenever you failed to help any of my people, no matter how unimportant they seemed, you failed to do it for me." Matthew 25: 44-45 (Really? We are to care for Jesus, love Jesus by caring and loving for those who seem unimportant? What would that look like?)

"What is the most important commandment?" Jesus answered, "The most important one says: 'People of Israel, you have only one Lord and God. You must love him with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength.' The second most important commandment says: 'Love others as much as you love yourself.' No other commandment is more important than these." Mark 12:29-31 (How? In 2000+ years we have gotten this so wrong so often! How can we ever get it right?)

"No matter how much you pray, I won't listen.

You are too violent.

¹⁶ Wash yourselves clean!

I am disgusted

with your filthy deeds.

Stop doing wrong ¹⁷and learn to live right. See that justice is done. Defend widows and orphans and help those in need." Isaiah 1:15-17 (God, disgusted with us? Could this mean us, 21st century Christians too and not just pre-common era Hebrews? Are we too violent? Are we doing justice, defending widows, orphans and those in need to the extent that God desires?)

I came that they may have life and have it abundantly. John 10:10 (Really? Then what is abundant life?)

I will be with you always, even until the end of the world. Matthew 28:20 (Then why does it seem as if God is not with us at times?)

God's home is now with his people. He will live with them, and they will be his own. Yes, God will make his home among his people. ⁴ He will wipe all tears from their eyes, and there will be no more death, suffering, crying, or pain.

These things of the past are gone forever. Revelation 21: 3-4 (No more death or suffering? Can it really be true when some days it feels so far from possible?)

The group of followers all felt the same way about everything. None of them claimed that their possessions were their own, and they shared everything they had with each other. ³³ In a powerful way the apostles told everyone that the Lord Jesus was now alive. God greatly blessed his followers, ³⁴ and no one went in need of anything. Acts 4:32-34 (Now that is just too farfetched to believe! Or is it?)



DRAFT Council Meeting Minutes May 6, 2014

- I. The Amazing Grace Lutheran Church council meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm by President Mark Smalley. (Note this is not the regular meeting time. Monthly meetings begin at 6:30.)
- II. Opening devotions were read by Mark.
- III. Prayer tasks were assigned as follows: Thanksgiving/, Intercession/, Petition/, Praise/.
- IV. Assign Time Keeper and opinion Collector tasks.
- V. Mark noted that a quorum was established for this meeting.
- VI. The Agenda was reviewed and m/s/a.
- VII. The minutes from the last meeting, April 1, 2014, were m/s/a with minor corrections. Members were reminded to "Reply All" when making any corrections to the minutes so everyone is aware of them. Minutes will officially be approved at the meeting, yet this allows the best "draft" copy to be printed in the Spirit.
- VIII. Financial Reports:
 - Treasurer's Report Chrissie Kincaid Bills were approved for payment.

There was discussion about the current arrangement of two signers on the checks; and if this has been too inconvenient.

- Financial Secretary's Report Mike Kupka.
 - Mike submitted the April 2014 Record of Giving was \$13,187.56.
 - Mike will give a report on electronic giving for the Spirit.

It was noted that checks that were designated for a particular fund had just been put in the general fund by the depositors. Mike agreed that procedures for the depositors needed to be reviewed and he will schedule a depositor training in the near future.

It was recommended that the depositors be two unrelated church members for good fiscal management.

- IX. Business items:
 - A. Stewardship Committee Members Diane and Mark will recruit members for this committee.
 - B. Weddings of same sex couples at Amazing Grace It was m/s/a to allow pastor to officiate at marriages of same-sex couples at Amazing Grace.
 - C. Policy Committee Gene Schermer and Arlene Torgerson will work on the policy manual.

- D. Disposition of money from forgiven paint fund loan. ½ will be distributed to the Endowment fund and ½ to the general fund. Pastor Val confirmed this was how the donors intended that it be divided.
- E. Opportunity of 5th Sunday Service with the Presbyterians on June 29th and the end of August. There is a 5th Sunday on June 29th. For those at AG who wish to participate will leave right after Pastor announces it, yet there will still be a full service for those who want to stay. There will a 5th Sunday in August as well.
- F. Matching Funds Judy Hubbard requested to know what the funds for the pie auction would be used for. Several ideas were discussed, but no action was taken. Apply to Thrivent for matching funds to assist with some projects at church.
 - G. Changing the Date of the Council Meeting It was m/s/a to move the date of the Council Meeting to the second Tuesday of the Month to allow more time for the Treasurer and Financial Secretary to put the reports together and distribute them to the council before the meeting to allow a more complete review.

IX. Ministry Reports

A. Property – Coleman Carle

Electrical work in the organ room: the bid from Jones' Electric was for \$1,120. We made \$1270 from the Hodge's anniversary dinner. It was m/s/a to repair the electrical in the organ room.

Skywalk and Breezeway Roof Repairs: It was m/s/a to complete the repair of skywalk by Lupo Construction for \$4500. The sources of the money will be the Paint the Church Fund and the General fund. **Carpet Cleaning quotes**: The sanctuary is most in need of cleaning. The breezeway will be cleaned when the fellowship hall is cleaned. Coleman will ask the Wednesday crew of men if they would be willing to look into some quotes for us.

Fire Extinguishers: The extinguishers will be worked on Wednesday, the 7th.

BelAire Property: We need to plan dates to perform a spring clean on the property. A committee needs to be brought together to get this task accomplished so the congregation can spend some time on the property and then make recommendations to council of what to do with the property. This plan was approved earlier in the year.

B. Fellowship – Dee Erickson Absent/ No report

C. Outreach – Kristine Finazzo

We will be collecting new underwear for men and boys on Father's Day. We will call it "Undies Sunday". There will also be donations collected for the women's shelter for Mothers Day.

\$250 Thrivent funds can be applied for annually to go towards specific projects. Kristine continues to hear from folks on desires of how to serve our local youth/teens at risk as well as our international neighbors.

- D. Youth & Family Pastor met with Chris and the Sunday school teachers. VBS will be June 23rd-26th, it will be held at the Presbyterian Church, yet dinners will be at AG.
 Confirmation Sunday has been moved to Reformation Sunday in the fall so to not give our Confirmation
 - students the impression they are "graduating" from church.

E. Worship - Diane Hanson

Diane proposed we put in the Spirit that will remove the green hymnals and that folks who want to take one for their personal use may do so until a said date. After said date we will ship what we can afford to, to another church in need. We will then request funds for additional red hymnals.
