#### **HUMBLE WALK**

James 1: 22-25 You must be doers of the word and not only hearers who mislead themselves. <sup>23</sup> Those who hear but don't do the word are like those who look at their faces in a mirror. <sup>24</sup> They look at themselves, walk away, and immediately forget what they were like. <sup>25</sup> But there are those who study the perfect law, the law of freedom, and continue to do it. They don't listen and then forget, but they put it into practice in their lives. They will be blessed in whatever they do.



The life of discipleship, learning how to follow and trust Jesus is hard. It's really hard! Our usual approach to learning is to "just do it" or "power through it" or "get 'er done'. But we can't follow Jesus without walking in **the** way of Jesus so there can be no triumphalism, no sense in which we just need to try harder. The usual ways of learning and following are trivialized when Jesus begins our instruction in the way of discipleship by telling us to 'take up your cross and follow me.' The things that work in other parts of our lives are useless in discipleship. Winning by dying, losing our lives to keep them – this is not the way of strength or high test scores or charm. This is walking the way of Jesus in the way of Jesus with Jesus.

For the next few weeks in worship we'll be hearing what the book of James can teach us about this **Humble Walk with Jesus**. Martin Luther made critical remarks



James to learn how to walk with Jesus in our own place and time in the way of Jesus.

## BISHOP JAECH'S LETTER ON RACISM

20 June 2015

Dear Friends,

These past three days I have felt continuing waves of grief, shock and anger following the killing of nine members of Emanuel African Methodist Episcopal (AME)
Church in Charleston, S.C., who



were gunned down by a young white man at their church. Over and over again during the past months, we have witnessed acts of racial violence against African Americans in our country. The slaughter of good and loving people during a Bible study takes us even deeper into a place of raw injustice and fear.

The event becomes even more personal as we discover our Lutheran connections to this tragic event. Emanuel AME's pastor, the Rev. Clementa Pinckney, was a graduate of the Lutheran Theological Southern Seminary, as was the Rev. Daniel Simmons, an associate pastor at Mother Emanuel. Both were killed in this shooting. The man who killed them, Dylann Roof, is a member of an ELCA congregation in South Carolina. This was an "in-family" murder and we cannot pretend to stay uninvolved.

I suspect that Dylann Roof's defense lawyers will probably plead that he is mentally ill and therefore not responsible for his actions. While he is undoubtedly mentally wounded, his violence is clearly an expression of the ingrained racism and violent hatred ingrained throughout our country. We cannot dismiss this as the aberrant act of one misguided

# **RiverCity Update**

We're one month into hosting the former residents of the camp at the Chehalis River, who now call themselves RiverCity Village. The expressions of gratitude from the residents bring tears to my eyes. They are grateful for a simple space of asphalt in a parking lot. They are grateful for the safety and privacy of fencing. They are grateful for the outpouring of food and equipment that they have received not only from Amazing Grace members but from the community at large. They are grateful for the decency shown them in providing warm showers, porta potties and dumpster.

Most of all they are grateful for being treated like human beings. Time and time again I hear one or another person say, "No one ever showed they cared before. No one ever treated me like a human being." They are astounded and amazed that a church would do this. Their experience with churches has usually been a handout tied to a sermon and often accompanied by judgment. A church simply showing unconditional love is beyond anything they could have imagined. A phrase I've heard from many people, RiverCity residents and community members is, "When no one else would step up to help Amazing Grace did."

That witness to the gospel of Jesus to show unconditional love, and to show that love through tangible acts: feeding the hungry, giving sanctuary to the homeless, and a cup of cool water to the thirsty speaks volumes about our faith and acts as evangelism better than any media campaign ever could.

Thank you for allowing me to serve in God's mission to Aberdeen and to the most vulnerable with you. We're all in this together!

person. Dylann Roof was shaped and twisted by the systemic racism that batters people of color each day when they go to school, apply for jobs, look for housing or simply drive down the street.

What can we do? We can begin, first by praying for the families in Charleston that have experienced such tragic loss. I have included a prayer at the bottom of this letter that can be a resource for you in your congregation.

We can pray for Dylann Roof and our entire nation, asking that God will free us from our conditioned hatred and suspicion of one another.

Perhaps most importantly, we can work to end racism by entering into active dialogue and mutual support with members of the African American community. In Ephesians 2, Paul writes: "Christ Jesus is our peace; in his flesh he has broken down the dividing walls of hostility." Jesus often starts this peace process by simply by bringing us together to talk and understand each other's lives. We need to move from being strangers to being family again.

Out of the tragedy in Charleston, I have made a commitment to immediately begin meeting the AME pastors in our Synod. I want to listen to their stories and learn from them. I recognize that I will need to wrestle with my own racial ignorance and suspicions along the way. But it will be a

step in the healing process. I encourage each of you to join me and choose one specific action that you will do in the next month that will help break down our racial divide.

At a court bond hearing in Charleston on Friday, the family members of those who were slain were allowed to speak to Dylann Roof. They spoke about the pain of their loss, but each one of them announced to Dylann that they forgave him and prayed that he would repent and discover the peace that God wished for him. I can barely comprehend the deep well of love and graciousness in their hearts that enabled them to forgive. Yet I know that they were being fed by the well of living water that springs from Christ and from the throne of God. That is our only hope as we strive to end and move beyond racism and violence.

Blessings to you and to our nation as we walk this path.


