God.



I am incredibly thankful and profoundly moved by the generosity of this congregation in sharing our little piece of asphalt, our time, our energy and even in a real way our reputation.

There are people who have condemned us for opening this

space to people in need. They have called it enabling. They feared we were ruining the neighborhood. The worst case fears have not materialized. The people calling this sharing of our space enabling are unaware of all of the factors that cause people to experience homelessness in our community.

May God open our hearts to each other so that we live not as haves and have nots but as brothers and sisters, bearing one



LETTER FROM BISHOP JAECH

July 7, 2015

Dear Friends at Amazing Grace,

It was a joy to be with you on June 28 for your worship service and the excellent conversation we had together at coffee hour after church. Your faith and your commitment to ministry show through all that you do and say.



I especially want to thank you for your courageous and loving ministry to the homeless people of Aberdeen. I think that it is a wonderful witness of God's love that you have provided your church parking lot as a living area for the River City community. Furthermore, through the generosity of your members and people from all over Aberdeen, you have provided them with tents, showers and cooking grills as well.

In Matthew 25, Jesus said to those he welcomed to the heavenly gates, "I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me." His followers asked, "Lord, when did we do this for you?" Jesus answered, "Whenever you do this for one of the least of my brothers or sisters, you do this for me."

You at Amazing Grace are truly living out Jesus' words and calling as you respond with care for the homeless. I applaud also the way in which you are caring for one another in your congregation as you develop and carry out this ministry. New projects are often complicated and need ongoing problem solving and improvement. Your leadership team, Church Council and your whole congregation all bring great skill, good questions and the ability to listen and learn from each other along the way.

Residents of Rivercity celebrate every win, no matter how small and we celebrate with them. We celebrate people working together for the safety of everyone. We celebrate people feeling more confident in their own abilities as they exercise leadership, struggle with problems and solve them together. We celebrate more and more community members who as they interact with Rivercity members grow in understanding that they are just like everyone else with the hopes, dreams and disappointments we all face.

Living in community, whether it's a tent city or a church family, communication is the key to understanding and building relationships. As our congregation has been challenged by communication which was intended to be clear and comprehensive but fell short of those goals, so too has Rivercity faced communication challenges. The leadership presents the rules but not everyone is at the meetings. The rules are posted, but not everyone takes the time to read them. People try to help each other abide by community determined guidelines but they don't make sense to everyone.

The more we walk with our friends and neighbors trying to build a better life one step at a time, the more we learn that we have more in common than that which distinguishes us from each other. One advantage many people who live in houses have over those who do not is a support system, family or friends who were there to bail us out of trouble we got ourselves into or mistakes we inadvertently made. One of the goals of hosting a tent city as Amazing Grace is doing is to be that support

system for people who have not been able to count on that in their lives for many

different reasons. We don't try to live their lives for them. They alone will suffer the consequences of bad choices and benefit from good ones made. But, we try to support them in making those good choices, having good boundaries and we mourn their losses with them and celebrate their successes.

Thank you for praying for Rivercity residents, for the A.G. Leadership Team, for Pastor Val, for the city and city council as well as for our own congregation as we all work together for the sake of the beloved community becoming more and more a reality on earth as it is in heaven.

Amazing Grace and RiverCity Village Featured in the SWW Synod's July 2015 Moments for Mission

Amazing Grace Lutheran, Aberdeen, Provides a Home for the Homeless

Congratulations to Amazing Grace Lutheran in Aberdeen, who on June 1st began an exciting new ministry to the homeless. They have turned their church parking lot into a tent city where 22 homeless people can safely live. Equipped with shower facilities, a cooking area and portable toilets, Amazing Grace will offer this hospitality for the next three months. It is hoped that in September another church in Aberdeen will offer their parking lot for the next three-month period.



The homeless people living at Amazing Grace (plus a dog named Trinity!) take an active part in managing themselves and keeping the area safe and clean. They have named themselves River City, since they formerly lived in an undeveloped area along the bank of the Chehalis River as it flows through Aberdeen into Grays Harbor. When the city decided to clear out that area and make it into a park, there were no other sites for homeless people to live within Aberdeen. Pastor Val Metropoulos of Amazing Grace, and other pastors in the city, brainstormed with city agencies and social services, searching for ways to give intermediate help to the homeless. It was then that Amazing Grace volunteered to be the first site for a tent city.

Members of Amazing Grace have been active and generous in supporting River City with camping equipment, food and other necessities. Other residents of Aberdeen, who had no previous relationship with Amazing Grace, have joined in to support River City as well. Amazing Grace's leadership team is creating a workbook that describes how the tent city was organized and how challenges and questions were dealt with along the way. This will be a very useful resource to other congregations in our Synod who may consider helping the homeless in a similar fashion.



QUILTER'S NEWS

Even though school for the 2014-2015 year just ended, within the next two weeks our local box stores will start advertising specials on school supplies for next year! We plan to send 150 school kits with our shipment of quilts to Lutheran World Relief in October, so now is the time to buy the items that are needed for each Kit. The following items are needed for each kit:

- 1 -2 ½ inch eraser
- 5 black or blue ball point pens (NO GEL INK); secure with a rubber band
- 1 box 24 crayons (Crayola is best)
- 1 blunt scissors
- 5 unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure with a rubber band
- 1 30 centimeter ruler or a ruler with centimeters on one-side and inches on the other
- 1 pencil sharpener
- 4 70 sheet notebooks of wide or college-ruled paper approximately 8 by 10 ½" (NO LOOSELEAF PAPER)

You are welcome to contribute all items for a kit or just buy one. IF you would like to contribute money we would be happy to do the shopping for you. Items may be given to Darci in the office or put on the table in the parish hall. We are working on the bags this summer and they will be available in early September. Thanks in advance for supporting this worthwhile parish ministry.
