Everything Has Become New

by Bishop Rick Jaech
In the Academy Museum in Florence, Italy,
you find Michelangelo's incredible statue
of David, but in the hallway leading up to
David, another statue catches your attention. It is Michelangelo's unfinished statue
of St. Matthew. St. Matthew looks as
though he is trapped in the rock and trying to escape.



Michelangelo talked about this when someone asked him how he did his work. He said, "I went to the quarry and looked for a block of stone with the stirring of life in it. My task was then to chip away the marble to free the figure within."

As we celebrate the birth of Christ and also enter into a New Year, we are in a time of new beginnings. Even as God stirred miraculous new life in Mary, so God comes to breathe new life into us and into our world. Yet, as we look around and within us, we realize that creation is still a work in process. In tragic and painful ways, we remain trapped by the stony shells of fear, suspicion, judgment and violence.

Families are shattered; children die daily; nations are locked in war. Therefore, through the incarnate Christ, God comes to chip away the stone that entraps us in order to free us to new life.

As Mary and Joseph modeled for us, God also invites us to share in the task of setting creation free.

Mary said, "Let it be with me according to your word." In trust, she allowed her own life to be made into something entirely new. In so doing, she became a co-creator with God of a new world, enabling the new Way of grace and peace to be born. ³

Chrissie recommended making any name changes in December to be effective for February 1, 2016.

<u>Financial Secretary's Report</u> – Mike Kupka Mike provided the reports showing all contributions for November and the 2015 Accumulative Report

2016 Proposed Budget – Mark/Chrissie/Mike - M/S/P

M/S/P - Approval to ADD some funds (\$2,250) to maintenance for Church Home as a budget line item. Approval to ADD (\$250) for Music.

M/S/P –Approval to hire a Treasurer for reports and part of Chrissie's current duties. Theresa Kaufman has AGREED - to SERVE FOR these duties. Appreciation was expressed to Mike and Chrissie for all their work the past two years on the finances and committing so much time for the church.

Business items: Annual Reports based on our Vision and Mission Statement – Needed by January 8 for Annual Meeting on January 31st – Mark

-Coleman requested a copy of last year's property report. Susan will send to him. (Done 12/11)

Audit Committee – Mark Darrell L and Gene S will be asked again this year to assist with the annual 'end-of-year' audit. Mike will forward the monthly reports to Chrissie.

Chairs for the fellowship hall – Kristine Members donated a \$1,000 for purchasing chairs for the Fellowship Hall. Different types of chairs are being researched before a decision is made.

Hearing assistance box and charging station – Kristine

There are two types of rechargers being looked at. There will be eight batteries and two charging units needed to keep four units operating for Sunday worship. The members agreed that another unit would be a good decision to meet the needs of the congregation.

Council Structure – Mark Treasurer Position – Council members approved to hire part time position for change per Chrissie's suggestion providing reports.



- Vice President Position The members suggested a rotating position to attend executive planning meetings; preferably two consecutive meetings in a row.
- Options for recruiting Property/Maintenance council position- Val recommended taking this request to the congregation. Susan will add a line item into the bulletin about this request for Property Maintenance (Done 12/10)
- Options for Restructuring Council were discussed.

Paid Youth Group Leader – Pastor suggested tabling this idea for now. We can take it to the congregation at the annual meeting. Reformation 500 year Anniversary – 2017 – Pastor Council will bring this to the congregation also – Volunteers will be asked at the annual meeting.

Ministry Reports

- <u>Fellowship</u> Chris Seelke was not able to attend the meeting. He will be meeting with Pastor to discuss fellowship items.
- <u>Worship</u> Diane Hanson -Volunteers have been in the process of decorating each week for Christmas. Amy Ostwald has been doing some incredible cut outs for the sanctuary. There is special music to share during worship over the holidays Charles Scamman and Edward Lapanawan will be sharing their talents this season.

Christmas Eve service will be at 6:00pm.

- M/S/P To allow Edward Lapanawan to borrow the electric piano keyboard to prepare for the performance on Dec 20^{th} . Susan and Val will develop an equipment lease agreement .(Done 12/11)
- Property Coleman Carle The urinal issue has been resolved. In the Youth Shelter it was discovered that the ladies bathroom urinal is running. This may need to be replaced soon. Office Bathtub corrosion in the pipes will need to be looked at. Estimate from plumber was \$500 to cut it out and remove the piece. Council expressed that the men's group will handle this task if they are able to t. Coleman plans on finishing the organ room and putting up dry wall. He is working with Keith to get windows finished. Sewer cameras/cap removal will be looked at. Coleman has one of the finishers working on the cabinet by organ to store music. Men's group is working on carpet on the front landing (outdoors) at top of the stairs; it is getting old and must be removed and/or replaced. There is leaking where concrete has cracked outside the front door to the road. Sealant needs immediate attention. Coleman suggested the next project be the roofing over the far end of the sanctuary. Mark mentioned a leak in the skyway and requested Coleman make the contact to Lupo Construction to repair this under warranty.
- <u>Outreach</u> Kristine Finazzo -Kristine shared that the Pie Auction went well and everyone seemed to have much fun. Appreciation was expressed to Thrivent Action Team for providing the main dishes.

Giving Tree ornaments are available for holiday donations and gifts.

Gift cards for the Youth Center and money for Heifer, Intl. will be collected following worship through Dec. 20th. Kristine also reported there is a plan is to have an Outreach Meeting soon to discuss contributions the cold weather shelter.

<u>Youth & Family</u> – Jeanette Green - Jeanette informed everyone that the PLU Concert trip was enjoyable and all who attended seem to have a memorable trip. Christmas Caroling & Chili Feed is scheduled for the 13th. Judi applied for a Thrivent card to help with this activity.

Feast for All is scheduled for the 19th. The Youth Group will assist with serving at the 1st Presbyterian Children's Program is planned for December 20th.

There is a pizza party and rehearsal on the evening of the 19th.

Council's Corner

At the end of this year, the council will have 3 openings; Treasurer, Property, Youth & Family. Amy Ostwald has agreed to serve on the council, starting next year, leading the Youth & Family committee.

We are still looking for a volunteer to lead the Property committee, so please give prayerful consideration to whether this is where God is calling you to serve at AGLC. Council members lead the work of the church according to our mission statement and values, calling on the people of the church to use their gifts for the sake of God's work at AGLC.

At a council retreat, we studied a book that recommended a council have no more than 6 members (not including the pastor), for a church the size of Amazing Grace. We had 9 members at that time, and this year we shrank the council to 8 members.

In trying to recruit people to serve on council for the coming year, I realize there is a limited pool of members of the congregation able to serve. The council needs to continue to change its structure to better match the abilities and time commitments of our congregation. That is why the council is exploring different ways of conducting the business of the church.

This last year, the council started this change process by having the Church Administrative assistant take notes at council. This eliminated the secretary position on council.

Chrissie Kincaid is stepping down from the treasurer position at the end of this year. Chrissie has been a blessing to us with her skills and insight, it is just a lot of work to ask a volunteer to step into. The council will vote at the December Council meeting on replacing the council position with a paid treasurer, who will report to the Financial Secretary on council.

For the Vice President position, Diane has been kind enough to pull double duty, leading the worship committee and being vice president. This has not been fair to Diane and has not allowed her follow her passion on the worship committee. So Diane is stepping down from the Vice President position. For next year, we are considering having the vice president position rotate through the other members of council each month, allowing them to meet as part of the Executive committee.

Obviously all of this is outside our current constitution and bylaws, which will require that they be rewritten and submitted to the congregation for approval.
