This Lenten season, we've centered our worship around the image of being filled to the brim with God's overflowing love. When we recognize that all that we are and all that we have comes from God whose love overflowed and birthed creation, that love spills out beyond ourselves and nourishes everyone and everything around us. We trust fully that we belong to God and so we welcome the invitation to increase our capacity to receive and to give grace.

We began by praying, that God would intervene in our world, bringing hope, and peace to us all and that God would use us to answer that prayer. This prayer is our breath, giving life itself to our bodies, our spirits and our community. Prayer is where we go FIRST in this life of faith and where we return again and again as we walk the road one step at a time, together!

We committed to learning about the ways in which our world is broken, especially in our own community. We gathered around the Hungering for Justice study materials in order to better understand hunger as a justice issue and how God calls us to work against it. This work of learning and growing never ends. We never graduate from doing justice, loving kindness or walking humbly with our God. (Micah 6:8) Our Lenten commitment establishes a habit that we continue during the Easter season as we gather as God's people to put what we've learned into practice together.

We continue to pray and to answer God's call to be the hands and hearts of hope in this world right now and to do something, even if it is only contributing the cost of one meal to ending hunger through the ELCA World Hunger Challenge. We discern together how God is calling us to be the answer to our prayer with each word and ever action we take in our lives.

Since God has already claimed us as God's own and nothing we can do will ever change that, we live each day with God's love flowing through us and into this parched world.

This poem from one of our Lent mid-week services reminds us that this commitment does not require us to be

anyone other than who we are. It does not require us to go anywhere but where we live our lives every day. It does not require special words or garments or buildings. It requires only an open and humble heart willing to let God fill it with God's love.

May you be filled to overflowing with the assurance of God's love for you, today and always!

AN EASTER TOUCH

Dear Friends in Christ,

As we journey through Lent towards Palm Sunday, Good Friday and Easter, here is a story from Luke's Gospel that jumps out at me. This translation is by Eugene Peterson in *The Message*-

"Not long after that, Jesus went to the village of Nain. His disciples were with him, along with quite a large crowd. As they approached the village gate, they met a funeral procession-

a woman's only son was being carried out for burial. And the mother was a widow. When Jesus saw her, his heart broke. He said to her, 'Don't cry.' Then he went over and touched the coffin. The pallbearers stopped. He said, 'Young man, I tell you: Get up.' The dead son sat up and began talking. Jesus presented him to his mother.

The villagers all realized they were in a place of holy mystery, that God was at work among them. They were quietly worshipful—and then noisily grateful, calling out among themselves, 'God is back, looking to the needs of God's people!' The news of Jesus spread all through the country." Luke 7:11-17

In Jesus' day, a faithful believer did not touch a dead person, or anything connected to death, such as a coffin. Doing so would make you spiritually impure and would distance you from God, or so they believed.

Jesus, however, revealed a deeper truth from the heart of God. God desires to bring us full life in every moment of death. Jesus' own heart broke when he saw the suffering of the widow mother who had lost her only son. Therefore, Jesus boldly touched death...touched the coffin...and so brought life roar-

ing back to the son. "God is back, looking to the needs of God's people!", the people shouted.

The point of this story is that, wherever there is death or sadness, Jesus enters and brings life.

That is also the message of the weeks ahead of us as we continue our Lenten journey. We will follow Jesus as he enters Jerusalem, confronts the authorities, is arrested and taken to the cross. We will follow Jesus as he enters the places of death, including his own death. Yet, wherever Jesus touches death, God works to bring life.

As we journey through Holy Week to Easter, we are also invited to let Jesus touch the places in our life and in our world where death holds us, whether that be in Ukraine or Southwestern Washington. Jesus' heart breaks when he sees us suffering. He mourns our physical pain. He mourns the breaks in our families and communities. He mourns the deadly grip of suspicion, abuse and violence that strangles our whole world right now.

Seeing Jesus on the cross, we wonder if we, too, are about to breath our last. We wonder if everything good we care about in the world is about to die. Then suddenly **God comes and turns death into life.**

"God is back, looking to the needs of God's people!" That's Easter. That's what God is preparing among us right now. Through Jesus, God welcomes us again and again to the table where we feast on grace, joy and community.

May God's full blessing bring new life to you, as we journey in this holy time of Lent through death to life.

PRO TIPS FOR HEALTHY COMMUNICATION AT AMAZING GRACE

Healthy communication is important in the best of times. Throw in a pandemic and political turmoil and things can get messy. **In the church we are especially careful to express our love for each other** and for all our neighbors by practicing healthy communication skills. Some basics that are helpful in all relationships include the following.

- Everyone speaks for themselves. Each of us needs to take responsibility for expressing our own feelings or concerns.
- When there is a concern, we go directly to the person involved. Honest, direct, loving communication is the basis of all healthy relationships.
- If the concern is not resolved after direct communication, we ask a neutral person to join us in that conversation for the sake of understanding and healing.
- We avoid triangulation. Triangulation occurs when one person does not communicate directly with another person, instead using a third person to relay communication to the second. Triangulation distorts relationships and makes clear communication difficult.
- We pray for each other trusting that God loves us all and in prayer can heal our hurts and restore relationships.
