... let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another... Hebrews 10:24-25

You are beautiful, you know. God said so at creation, creation of the universe and at your own creation God said, "Very good!" So, we don't have to wallow in the mistakes we make but, before you read any further, go look at the headlines online or read the newspaper, or listen to the news... Ok, are you back? Good.



We are **very good**; humanity is very good (or at least began that way and so that potential remains!) but it doesn't take a genius to see how far from very good we often are, as individuals, as a society and as a species. Which **makes Easter very good news**! God refused to let us wallow in our mistakes and our sin, our inability to ever get it right 100% of the time. So Jesus was born to show us how to live in this broken world but live in a way that God promises will bring us all healing; even brings healing to society. And when we messed even that up and killed the messenger of boundless love God said, **"Nice try but NO! Love will ultimately win every time!"** Jesus was resurrected opening the way to resurrected life for us all.

But, that's not the end of the story. Resurrection life and love triumphant is not just a nice story for after we die. It is the reality that God desires for you and me and all creation RIGHT HERE AND NOW! Which is why **Lent is very good news!** Every year we get six weeks to reflect on our own need for God's healing love. We get six weeks to reconnect with these people God has given us to share this life and this journey with from death into new, resurrected life. We get a time set apart for connection and beauty and reminders of why God put us here and what we are called to be and to do in this place.

But, only if you show up. Just like the Christian faith, Lent isn't a solo sport. God doesn't force you to do anything so you get to choose to put yourself in a place where you can love and be loved; where you can grow and learn.



So, you are invited to begin Lent with **Ash Wednesday service Feb.** 14th 7pm and you are invited every Thursday during Lent (2/22, 3/1, 3/8, 3/15, and 3/22) for time set apart to delight in one another, to learn together, to share our lives and our hopes for our world. We'll begin with an AGAPE meal from 5:15 – 6:00. Agape is selfless love best seen in God's love for us. We express agape love in this meal by keeping it simple, wholesome and keeping in mind those who will share it. (Think of stone soup with heart. So bring whatever

simple thing you can share with a loving heart, whatever that means to you. It will all be welcome and whatever is received will be sufficient.) In the spirit of selfless love, those who are able and willing will clean up and at 6:15 we'll watch a video and join in conversation around whatever BIG IDEA the video offers. About 7:30 we'll move

into the sanctuary for Holden Evening Prayer, a 30 minute time of quiet, music and prayer.

The IMAGINE team will be engaging the willing in brief conversations as we share a meal on these evenings. We invite you to commit during this six weeks to grow with us in the three primary relationships God calls us to, relationship with God, with each other and with our community.

Please consider committing to these six weeks of Lent to grow in those relationships and in faith with our God who loves us with such selfless abounding love!.

HELPING GRAYS HARBOR'S AT-RISK YOUTH

The 1st Sunday of each month we highlight the needs of the at-risk youth in our community. Our Caring Cupboard is a one-stop donation site for the Gravity Center, Youth Center and other entities that serve Grays Harbor Youth.

Youth Center—Needs include: pudding cups, fruit cups, granola bars, snack size bags of chips or pretzels, peanut butter or cheese crackers, individually packed bags of veggies and/or ranch, lunch meat



G.R.A.V.I.T.Y. Program

Typical Gravity Center kids are experiencing poverty and neglect. The kids are always hungry and can always use: Cup of Noodles, Instant cocoa packets, Bread, peanut butter and jelly, Canned tuna, Cookies and fruit. In addition the **teen parents** need: Diapers Size 1 or larger, baby wipes, soaps or lotions, clothes, bottles, Children's Tylenol, diaper rash creams.

This year Ash Wednesday and Valentine's Day fall on the same date. It seems like an odd pairing—Ash Wednesday, a day of solemn repentance and honest reckoning of our brokenness, and Valentine's Day, a lighthearted celebration of love. **Do we fast and pray and commit to rigorous spiritual disciplines, or do we dive in to Champagne and chocolate? Is it a day of contrition or of abandon? Do we abstain or do we indulge?** It's strange how our culture divides up human experience and the way it puts a premium on happiness, self-fulfillment and conflict avoidance, particularly in personal relationships. The good life is untroubled. There should be no worries and certainly no cause to acknowledge pain or wrong. It's a life of endless possibility fueled by positive thinking and affirmation. It should be perky, upbeat and fun. And somehow love needs to be shaped the same way. Certainly there is no room for Ash Wednesday and Valentine's Day in the same space.

The two quotes above are the manifesto for this worldview. They hold out the promise of pain-free, investment-free, responsibility-free relationships. They encourage an unexamined life, a kind of Teflon existence to which consequences don't stick. They sound like the real thing but are as poor a substitute as the sentiments printed on the little sugar valentine hearts are for a real expression of love. In this world, Ash Wednesday and Valentine's Day make no sense together. But here we are. This Feb. 14 will hold two holy days. And, in our life in Christ, they aren't incompatible but inseparable.

The history of salvation is one extended love story between God and God's creation, between God and humankind, between God and God's people. We were created in love for love. Real love. Love that is solid and deep and unflinching. Love that is true enough to be honest.

The history of salvation is one extended love story between God and God's creation, between God and God's people.

God's work of reconciliation in Christ is God's eyes-wide-open acknowledgment of human rebellion and sin, the undeniable fact that all is not well no matter how hard we try to fix it or deny it. The remedy was the all-in, complete love of the incarnation, crucifixion and death of Christ. Jesus meets us right in the middle of our pain—the pain we feel and the pain we cause others—and without minimizing the depth of our offense, offers forgiveness and new life. Love does *not* mean never having to say you're sorry—love means being *able* to say you're sorry.

Lutherans point out that grace is a gift, but sometimes we get a little carried away. I believe the sign in front of one of our congregations that claimed "Forgiveness guaranteed. Repentance optional" was trying to announce good news. Instead, it sent passers-by in the wrong direction. Our reconciled new life in Christ not only makes it possible for us to strip away any illusion of a whole and holy life that we bring about by ourselves, it compels us to repent.

Theologian and martyr Dietrich Bonhoeffer warned us about this cheap grace. He wrote: "Cheap grace is the grace we bestow on ourselves. Cheap grace is the preaching of forgiveness without requiring repentance, baptism without church discipline, communion without confession. ... Cheap grace is grace without discipleship, grace without the cross, grace without Jesus Christ, living and incarnate" (*The Cost of Discipleship*).

So, Ash Wednesday is a valentine from God, one that invites us to enter deep into the mystery of true love, honest examination of our lives and the possibility of real repentance. The Ash Wednesday valentine starts us on the journey to the cross, to the passionate love of God shown in the Passion of Christ. And after the cross, the resurrection. No more pretense, freedom.





ENDOWMENT FUND- YOUR MONEY MATTERS

You may have heard about it, may have read the bulletin, may have seen the Endowment Report in the Annual Report. But, what is it? where did it come from? what does it do?, and most importantly where is it going?

The Amazing Grace Endowment Fund was formed by the adoption of our constitution and merger with Trinity Lutheran in 2002. The Endowment Fund is governed by By-Laws within our constitution and the Endowment Committee is the custodian. As spelled out in the constitution: the purpose of the fund, is to enhance the mission outreach of the church; that income generated by the fund shall be used only as described in the By-Lays.

30% outreach and missions.

30% capital improvements.

10% out reach into our community.

10% youth activities and scholarships.

any or all of the above.

The Endowment Committee (4 members) decides annually how much of the fund's earnings will be distributed during the year, and to whom the funds will be distributed. Last year the committee distributed \$7,700 to the following: \$1,000 to Deep Roots/ New Life, \$1,200 Family Promise, \$2,400 Capital Improvements, \$500 AG Quilters, \$200 hand bell lights, \$2,400 Youth Scholarships. Currently the fund's value is approximately \$168,000.


