Sometimes the world just seems so solid. Reality is uncompromising and immutable. Literally, what you see is what you get, and our sight, our perception, is limited. So we forge on with all the obligations of daily life—family and work and taxes and deadlines. Our scope of existence becomes closed in, and our world gets smaller. Can this really be all there is?

The Christmas specials have started on TV, the familiar carols and songs are piped into grocery stores and shopping malls, and all kinds of media invoke the magic of Christmas. I don't know about you, but for me the result is not uninterrupted joy but longing and a sense of loss. Look at the war in one part of the world that brings starvation to many, including children who are powerless. The pandemics of COVID-19 and racism and hate speech cause us to be suspicious of each other and turn inward upon ourselves. Peace on earth, goodwill to all cannot withstand the sharp limits of the real world.

Yet every Christmastime we try to create perfection. If we just get it all right—the decorations, the celebrations, the traditions, the family gatherings—we can push past the limits of the solid world. This effort leaves me exhausted and nostalgic. There must have been a better time, a simpler time, a purer time. And even, if by some superhuman effort, we can create the perfect holiday, how does it feel on Dec. 26?

It's a funny thing, nostalgia. The word comes from the Greek *nostos*—return—and *algos*—pain. One scholar defined nostalgia this way: "the suffering evoked by the desire to return to one's place of origin." We have our origin story. It is the account in Genesis of Eden, where humankind lived in harmony with creation, a place of peace and plenty where God and God's creatures walked together. I believe that in some mystical way the memory of our place of origin exists in each of us. When we listen to the prophet Isaiah at Christmas, we are assured that God will restore that place: "The wolf shall live with the lamb, the leopard shall lie down with the kid, the calf and the lion and the fatling together, and a little child shall lead them" (Isaiah 11:6). We can't bring this about by ourselves. We can't go back, nor can we will Eden into the present. And yet there are times and places where the space between heaven and earth seems to dissolve. The Celts called these "Thin Places." The distance between heaven and earth collapses. It may only be a moment or feeling, but the sense that we are standing in the presence of the Holy becomes palpable.

During Advent and Christmas, the contrast between what the world is and what it was created to be is stark. We know that something is not right, but we also know that something is right. It's out there somewhere. Nostalgia becomes more acute and so does our desire to bring heaven to earth during this season. This is God's work, not ours.

The Incarnation is God's supreme liminal work. It is *the* Thin Place where heaven and earth touch. It is the tie and place where the suffering caused by our desire to return to our place of origin is ended because God has begun a new story where heaven and earth are joined. "Unexpected and Mysterious" describes this: "In a momentary meeting of eternity and time, Mary learned that she would carry both the mortal and divine" (*Evangelical Lutheran Worship*, 258).

Our seemingly solid world with its own reality and truth gives way to the blessed inbreaking of heaven with the true reality. Our origin, present and future are one in God, and God is with us when we perceive

it and, more importantly, when we do not.

This is the gift of Christmas.



# **GROWING AT AMAZING GRACE**

#### AGL REBOOT 2023

Church Council and Mutual Ministry Team are aware of and have been discussing issues and concerns within our congregation that are causing tension, dissatisfaction and frustration.

We have contacted the SW Synod Office of <u>Consul-</u> <u>tation to Clergy (CTC)</u>. CTC is a church-wide program offered to pastors and congregations struggling with communication, trust of leadership, goal setting and other issues impairing the health and vitality of a congregation.

Laurin Vance, Executive Director of CTC, as well as a retired Lutheran pastor has met with us, identified areas of concern and suggested options for us to move forward together as a family in Christ.

We have chosen a three-step process.

- 1. Congregation interviews.
- 2. Congregation-wide discerning assembly.
- 3. Implementing changes

**The congregation interviews** will be meetings with Laurin, either 1 on 1 or small groups of 2 to 4. They will be 45-minute sessions during which participants will be given the chance to discuss their perceived issues and concerns within the congregation. All interviews will be confidential. Laurin will take notes and write a report after each interview. No names

will be mentioned in his notes and reports. He will then write a summary of all the interviews and give it to the Council President who will work with Council and Mutual Ministry to formulate a priority list of concerns.

The congregation-wide discerning assembly will be scheduled to take place several weeks after the interviews have been completed. This will be a time for all to speak and hear a variety of points of view on selected issues and concerns. Priorities will be set and solutions will be recommended to appropriate governing bodies.

Laurin will moderate this assembly.

**Implementing changes** will occur as we move forward using the information gained in the first two steps.

There will be time for prayer and meditation throughout this process.

The congregation interviews will be conducted here at church by Laurin on January 19, 20 and 21. Tara Main will be posting a sign-up schedule for people to reserve time slots.

Please prayerfully consider participation in this opportunity. The more involvement we have by congregants the stronger our outcomes will be.

# WHAT IS THE GIFT POLICY AND WHY DOES AMAZING GRACE NEED ONE? Mark Smalley

In June of 2021, the church Council directed Pastor Val to pull together a committee to generate a Gift Policy. Gene Schermer, Arlene Torgerson, Phil Stegemoeller, Jim Weiberg, Pastor Val, and I were on the committee.

Fortunately for us, the Synod already had a Gift Policy template generated by the Synod lawyer. We met with Beth Adams, ELCA regional gift planner, who shared the template with us and walked us through what could be changed and what was legal boilerplate that was required due to IRS rules.

Two of the main purposes of the gift policy are:

- To give guidance to church leadership, so they know how to manage such gifts.
- To joyfully share the policy to encourage future giving, so that the givers can have confidence in how their gift will be managed.

Here are some of the terms in the policy that you may not be familiar with:

- Restricted Gifts those gifts given for a specific program or purpose
- Unrestricted Gifts those gifts given without a specification of which program they would benefit.
- First Fruits giving giving the first part of your harvest to God, because everything we have, was given to us by God. Sometimes we are tempted to give our offering after we have paid all of our bills, but first fruits guides us to give our offering to God first. Our Church Council at Amazing Grace has set the example for us, by following this practice for years. When we do our budget we set a percentage tithe for the year and that money comes out first every month before any bills are paid. Over the years, the council raised the giving % each year, until it reached the Bible based 10%. This tithe is split (as decided by council and approved in the budget) between the SW WA Synod, Union Gospel mission, Namibian Lutheran Church, Friends in Need, PLU, Grays Harbor Food Bank, Habitat for Humanity, Living Stones Ministry, and Family promise.

Questions we were asked by congregation members:

• <u>Does this change how our current endowment fund works?</u> No the current endowment fund has its own bylaws.

- <u>What does the Note on Page 3 mean that "Donors may not direct the way a gift is invested or utilized"?</u> This may seem contradictory for a restricted gift, but it relates to IRS rules. For example, you could designate a gift for scholarships, but you cannot designate who gets the scholarships.
- <u>Why is there an option to create a different endowment fund?</u> Our current endowment fund's giving is very clearly spelled out in its bylaws. If someone wants to have an endowment that is for a different purpose and they are willing to plant it with at least \$25,000, we want a policy to line out how to do that.

An important part of the policy are Exhibit A – the Gift Worksheet, and Exhibit B- the Restriction and Release Form. One issue that all church councils have is turn over and loss of institutional memory. These forms should help solve some of those issues by clearly spelling out what the gift is to be spent on. The release of the restriction is also important to spell out how designated funds are to be released from their designation. If a donor gives us \$30,000 for a specific purpose, but it only costs us \$27,000, the church cannot use the \$3000 for any other purpose without going to the donor to get a release. This form will clean up that process, so everyone will know how it will work.

The committee met with those who had questions after service on November 20<sup>th</sup>. We will do another session in early January, so we are ready to vote on the Gift Policy at the Annual Meeting.
