¹⁶ So we do not lose heart. Even though our outer nature is wasting away, our inner nature is being renewed day by day. ¹⁷ For our slight, momentary affliction is producing for us an eternal weight of glory beyond all measure, ¹⁸ because we look not at what can be seen but at what cannot be seen, for what can be seen is temporary, but what cannot be seen is eternal.

That passage from 2 Corinthians was in my daily devotional reading while I was on leave this past winter. Those words touched me deeply as I sat in the warmth and light of the fire, day after day, resting, sleeping, BE-ing. We are like clay jars. In that time, I felt like I was a fragile, cracked, even broken clay jar.

The past few years, managing all that the pandemic threw at us, left me feeling as if there was nothing left to give. Many of you were called up to do hard things in that time, so you may recognize my experience. We had to find our way with no road map, be responsible, at least to some extent, for the physical, emotional and spiritual health of others while managing our own. We had to make decisions that could have serious consequences, with little guidance. All of it was draining, as you know! And that time has left us untethered in a sense, adrift in a changed world. Everything has changed! People have been changed by the experience. Our institutions have changed. For many people, priorities have changed. And certainly, the church has been changed by the experience.

By the time I recognized that I needed help, the exhaustion I felt was so deep and profound that I could not think clearly. My body was not functioning normally. Most profoundly distressing though was that I could not pray. I could pray FOR people (intercessory prayer). But I could not pray the deep "resting-in-God" prayer that had so often kept me grounded (Centering Prayer or Christian Meditation.) Without that time to simply sit, sleep, think and BE I do not know what would have become of me. Thank you for that profound gift of time. Thank you for your care and understanding and support. Thank you for your cards and emails and texts and especially, thank you for your prayers.

As we remembered at Ash Wednesday, this clay jar is really only dust and to dust we shall all return. With rest and time and prayer, I too can say, that despite my brokenness, "I do not lose heart." Thank you for holding me, while I could not pray.

Let us hold one another and together hold this congregation, gathered by the Spirit to BE Christ's body here so that even when we are afflicted, we are not crushed! Even when we are perplexed we will not be driven to despair; when we are persecuted we will not be forsaken, and when we are struck down we will not be destroyed! Regardless of what lies ahead, we can thrive together, if we choose to, because we carry in these clay jars the death of Jesus, the truth that God is faithful to us in suffering and in joy, "so that the life of Jesus may also be made visible in our bodies." Thanks be to God!


