Dear Southwestern Washington Synod leaders,

On May 6, six days before Mother's Day, US Attorney General Jeff Sessions ordered Border Agents to forcibly separate children from their mothers if they are caught seeking refuge in the United States without proper documents. The children, who are fleeing murder and violence in their home countries, are to be taken to one detention facility where they may stay for months, while their mothers and fathers are taken to another.

I was revolted when I heard this news. The last time I saw such a thing happen was when I viewed WWII film clips of Nazi German soldiers forcibly pulling children from their parents as they were taken to the camps. I do not make that comparison lightly or without taking seriously what I am implying. While Hitler's actions were even more unspeakably horrible because he was sending Jewish families to death camps, it is fundamentally horrible and inhumane to separate young children from their parents in any circumstance. It furthermore endangers the very soul of our nation to act in such a cruel fashion.

I recognize that there are major challenges and problems we must address regarding the movement of refugees and immigrants coming to our country. We need borders that are safe and regulated, while at the same time we need to assist neighboring countries to become more stable so that families are not forced to flee for their lives.

However, no matter what the crisis, it is absolutely against the way of Jesus to separate five-year-old children from their mothers for months at a time as a tactic to stop refugee migration.

In WWII Germany, Lutherans were largely silent when the Nazis acted so inhumanely. We Lutherans cannot be silent again when children are being abused. I urge you to exercise your rights and responsibilities as citizens and contact your US representatives and senators, asking them to oppose the separation of children from parents. If you would like more background on the children that are seeking refuge, I recommend that you go to our national ELCA web page that tells about the AMMPARO program, which ministers to migrant children. <a href="https://www.elca.org/ammparo">https://www.elca.org/ammparo</a>

Finally, I welcome your response to these words, including if you disagree with me. I know that there are many deeply felt opinions on the immigration issue and I respect that. However, I also feel it is better to talk openly and honestly than remain silent when children's lives and the deepest values of our nation are at stake. May God continue to bring us wisdom and courage.

#### HELPING GRAYS HARBOR'S AT-RISK YOUTH

The 1st Sunday of each month we highlight the needs of the at-risk youth in our community. Our Caring Cupboard is a one-stop donation site for the Gravity Center, Youth Center and other entities that serve Grays Harbor Youth.

**Youth Center**—Needs include: pudding cups, fruit cups, granola bars, snack size bags of chips or pretzels, peanut butter or cheese crackers, lunch meat and individually packed bags of veggies and ranch dressing.

#### G.R.A.V.I.T.Y. Program

Typical Gravity Center kids are experiencing poverty and neglect. The kids are always hungry and can always use: Cup of Noodles, Instant cocoa packets, bread, peanut butter and jelly, canned tuna, cookies and fruit. In addition the **teen parents** need: Diapers Size 1 or larger, baby wipes, soaps or lotions, clothes, bottles, Children's Tylenol, diaper rash creams. These items may be left in the basket in the Parish Hall for pick up and delivery by Vicki Mitchell.

### **QUILTERS**

Now is the best time to buy the school supplies that are needed in the school kit as our big box stores are having good sales every week. Below you will find a list of items needed for one school kit. If you wish you may give any quilter a donation and we will do the shopping for you! Thanks in advance for supporting this project.

Include the following items in each school kit:

Four 70 sheet notebooks (280-300 sheets total) of wide or college-ruled paper ( NO LOOSE LEAF PAPER)

One 30 centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
One Pencil Sharpener
One pair of blunt scissors

Five unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band Five black or blue ballpoint pens (NO GEL INK) secure together with a rubber band One box of 16 or 24 crayons (Crayola is best)

One 2 1/2" eraser

#### FOR THE SABBATH

From the Daily Devotions 'God Pause' produced by Luther Seminary

Psalm 92:1-4,12-15

- 1. It is good to give thanks to the Lord, to sing praises to your name, O Most High;
  - 2. to declare your steadfast love in the morning, and your faithfulness by night,
    - 3. to the music of the lute and the harp, to the melody of the lyre.
- 4. For you, O Lord, have made me glad by your work; at the works of your hands I sing for joy...
  - 12. The righteous flourish like the palm tree, and grow like a cedar in Lebanon.
  - 13. They are planted in the house of the Lord; they flourish in the courts of our God.
    - 14. In old age they still produce fruit; they are always green and full of sap,
  - 15. showing that the Lord is upright; he is my rock, and there is no unrighteousness in him

This psalm's heading "For the Sabbath" makes sense. It talks about giving thanks; singing praises; declaring God's love; and making music. All things we do in worship. Yet, sometimes I worry that we might think of worship as a play. The worshipers are the audience. The clergy is the emcee. The musicians are the entertainment, and God is the prompter in the wings. Shouldn't it be the other way around? The worshipers are the performers; the clergy and musicians are the prompters; and God is the only audience.

Has worship become a place where we expect to be entertained? How can we move from observing to bursting forth with passion and praise? If we truly believed in the attributes and characteristics of God, we couldn't help but join in with our passion and praise. "Did I get anything out of worship?" is the wrong question. Rather we could ask: "Did my worship make God smile?"

Holy Lord, correct us when we make worship about us--when we let our tastes and preferences override glorifying you. You alone are worthy of our praise. Amen.

#### **VBS REPORT**


VBS took place last week of June. We had great joint participation from our other neighborhood churches: 1st Presbyterian, Methodist and St. Andrew's Episcopal. Each of the pastors from those churches (including Pastor Val) led the Bible story of the day. Each church prepared a meal. We had approximately 80 people per day Monday thru Thursday (includes kids and adults). After the meal and opening session the time was split between Amazing Grace (more story & Faith 5) and 1st Pres (craft). We used Faith Five woven into the format of the VBS curriculum and using that format went amazingly well. Way better than we could have hoped. It truly felt like the spirit was working among us. We had some Bible story drama and convinced Father Evan from St. Andrew's to play Jesus and Jared & Trace Erwin each played Zaccheus ... among other actors and roles. 
