Over the years and in the last two Lenten seasons we've heard about and from Jean Vanier, the remarkable founder of L'Arche who died on May 7. L'Arche is a network of communities across the world, each consisting of adults with and without physical and mental disabilities living alongside one another.

Vanier's life reflected his theological understanding of the sacredness of belonging. The day after Jean Vanier's death, a JustFaith community member sent the staff the following note, which was posted in January 2015 on Jean Vanier's

#### official site:

I would like to share a prayer with you, written by my sister Thérèse when she was 80 years old. It is like a testament that she has left us:

May oppressed people and those who oppress them, free each other.

May those who are handicapped and those who think they are not, help each other.

May those who need someone to listen, touch the hearts of those who are too busy.

May the homeless bring joy to those who open their doors reluctantly.

May the lonely heal those who think they are self-sufficient.

May the poor melt the hearts of the rich.

May seekers be truth giving life to those who are satisfied that they have found it.

May the dying who do not wish to die be comforted by those who find it hard to live.

May the unloved be allowed to unlock the hearts of those who cannot love.

May prisoners find true freedom and liberate others from fear.

May those who sleep on the streets again, share their gentleness with those who cannot understand them. May the hungry tear the veil from the eyes of those who do not hunger after justice.

May those who live without hope cleanse the hearts of their brothers and sisters who are afraid to live.

May the weak confound the strong and save them.

May violence be overcome by compassion.

May violence be absorbed by men and women of peace. May violence succumb to those who are totally vulnerable, that we may all be healed.

Amen.

This prayer conveys well what L'Arche is, and reflects what Lytta Basset was saying a few weeks ago at Trosly. This Swiss theologian and psychotherapist came to tell us the importance for each human being looked on with tenderness. Someone then asked her how one could be tender toward Jihadists! She replied: "It is important to pray for each one, so that their true humanity can rise up, and so that they do not stay locked in mad violence." The important thing is that we be transformed and that we open our hearts to other people.

I hold you closely in my heart, and ask you to pray for me and for us all.

May God continue to transform us! Jean

In this summer time as the beauty and the abundance that the earth provides fills our senses, if we take time each day to read these words so dear to Jean we will be grounded in what matters and in our true identity as God's beloved sharing this life with all these others, also God's beloved!

May this time be rich and gentle, peace-filled and awakening your spirit to God's delight in you and in people and all of creation!

I echo Vanier's sentiments:

I hold you closely in my heart, and ask you to pray for me and for us all.

God's work. Our hands.

The good people at <u>Lenoir-Rhyne University</u>'s Living Well Center for Vocation and Purpose invited me to address the school on the topic "Lives Worth Living." Yikes! This is one of The Questions in life—right up there with "What is the meaning of life?" and "What is true, beautiful and good?" and "Where do socks go after you put them in the dryer?"

For me, this turned out to be a good, if slightly disturbing, time of reflection. Our lives can be consumed with busyness—all the stuff that we do or need to get done to make it through the day, week, year, life. A lot of this is necessary, some not so much. Even those called to public ministry get swept up in the endless round of meetings, reports and events. And some in this world don't have the luxury of carving out time for contemplation as they struggle to keep their families fed, clothed and safe from harm.

As I write this it is <u>Lent</u>, a time of reflection and examination. I do have the privilege of time and, with the added incentive of a deadline, here are some thoughts.

#### **Questions in life**

We are inundated with messages of salvation, or at least better lives, through things. Ads for products as diverse as cars, toothpaste, brokerage firms, weed killers and more are carefully crafted to cast an aspirational vision of the good life. Sometimes this vision of the good life is presented in such a beguiling way that one forgets what product is being advertised. It's possible to get lost if you go down this road. There will always be a new thing, the promise of a more beautiful you. It's there—just beyond reach.

Jesus warns us about this in the parable of the rich man, who believed he had attained the good life. "And I will say to my soul, 'Soul, you have ample goods laid up for many years; relax, eat, drink, be merry.' But God said to him, 'You fool! This very night your life is being demanded of you. And the things you have prepared, whose will they be?' " (Luke 12:19-20).

So, what's the point? If materialism doesn't bring meaning, why not just give up?

In Ecclesiastes we hear: "What has been is what will be, and what has been done is what will be

done; there is nothing new under the sun" (Ecclesiastes 1:9). Nihilism, oddly enough, can provide a frame for meaning. "Who cares?" can quickly become "Don't care." Protected from disappointment by withdrawing from this world of care is as tempting as a frenzied life in pursuit of self-made happiness.

I believe there is another way, a different way, of shaping our lives. The cruciform life is the life worth living. The cruciform life delivers us from our constant striving to make our lives have meaning through our own efforts. It saves us from the exhausting pursuit of self-justification and worth, from the loss of our true selves in all of our posturing.

Jesus, crucified and risen for the sake of the world, breaks through all of that. He breaks down all pretense on our part and all claims of salvation that the world offers. God comes to us, cherishes us, bids us to come to God's life and peace.

Augustine, an early Christian theologian, knew this when he wrote: "You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our heart is restless until it finds its rest in you."

The cruciform life also breaks through nihilism. Free from the necessity of saving ourselves, and from the numbness of the pointlessness of all that, the cross breaks us open to others, to the world. The rush of feeling back into a self that has cut itself off from circulation is painful. But it is also a sign of life. We can feel, we can touch and be touched by others. The cross sets us free to serve the neighbor. Here is the life worth living that God gives us.

## HELPING GRAYS HARBOR'S AT-RISK YOUTH

The 1st Sunday of each month we highlight the needs of the at-risk youth in our community. Our Caring Cupboard is a one- stop donation site for the Gravity Center and other entities that serve Grays Harbor Youth.

#### G.R.A.V.I.T.Y. Program

Typical Gravity Center kids are experiencing poverty and neglect. The kids are always hungry and can always use: Cup of Noodles, Instant cocoa packets, bread, peanut butter and jelly, canned tuna, cookies and fruit. In addition the **teen parents** need: Diapers Size 1 or larger, baby wipes, soaps or lotions, clothes, bottles, Children's Tylenol, diaper rash creams. These items may be left in the basket in the Parish Hall for pick-up and delivery by Vicki Mitchell.

#### **EXPLORATORY INTERNSHIP TEAM**

#### **SUMMER WORSHIP**




