Time to Be Brave

In the message last Sunday, August 4th, I asked you to be brave with me. We heard the story of the rich fool from Luke 12 about a man so wealthy he was contemplating building even bigger barns to hold all his riches. He was talking to himself because he'd spent his life amassing wealth and must have neglected human relationships – he had no one to talk to but himself. In this parable, Jesus says that as the man made these plans, God said to him, 'Fool, tonight you will die. Now who will get the things you have prepared for yourself?" and Jesus said, "This is the way it will be for those who hoard things for themselves and aren't rich toward God."

The key, Jesus is saying is for us to be 'rich toward God.'

I asked you to be brave, because I believe that Jesus is calling us to hear this message, not as a call to give more money to the church or even give more money to the poor. I think that Jesus is asking us to be brave and see that like the rich fool we have been worshipping false gods, idols. We have let other things get in the way of being 'rich toward God,' things that in and of themselves are not evil. But, given our hu-

man tendency to be fearful, those 'things' preoccupy our lives, giving us the illusion that they offer protection/safety/security, maybe even wealth of a sort.

But, that's not the way God's good world works. In God's economy, when we are motivated by fear no matter how much we have, no matter how big our portfolio or our retirement package, no matter how important or busy we are, no matter even how healthy or happy we are, when we are not rich toward God, putting God first in all things, then our lives become narrow and small; we cling to what we have, hoarding it against the feared unknown future.

Against that small, diminished life Jesus offers us God's abundant future, free to be received for those who can, even for a moment, now and then open their hands to receive the blessings that God longs to pour out upon us.

Human sinfulness (treating our 'stuff' or our own abilities as idols that can provide for us) encourages us to believe that giving, instead of taking, will lead only to destitution, deprivation, and desperation. The gospel promises that giving from what we have will open our hearts and minds to the God of blessing and prepare us to receive the gifts God offers.

In a time when it seems like every day brings new rea-

son to be afraid, being 'rich toward hope and generosity.

Seeking to put that attitude of hope and generosity into action, look at what our churchwide assembly, currently meeting in Milwaukee, WI has been up to:

They adopted the statement, "A Declaration of Inter-Religious Commitment" with 97.48% voting in favor. This document encourages and nurtures our interreligious relations as we strive to uphold these commitments in life together with people of other faiths and religions. Voting members at the ELCA Churchwide Assembly launched our participation in the Thursdays in Black Campaign -- towards a world without rape and violence. The ELCA's commitment to this World Council of Churches campaign is an expression of our commitments through the ELCA social message "Gender-based Violence."

More than 750 Lutherans, including voting members of the ELCA Churchwide Assembly, gathered in Milwaukee for a **prayer vigil in support of migrant children and families**. They walked from the Wisconsin Center to the nearby U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services, singing and praying. Then they went back to work and voted to approve a **memorial that declares the ELCA a sanctuary church**. The ELCA is the first North American denomination to declare itself a sanctuary church body. As a sanctuary church the ELCA is committed to serving and supporting migrant children and families in communities across the country.

A Declaration to People of African Descent was presented to representatives of the African Descent Lutheran Association. "This apology is a recommitment to the process of right and equitable relations within this church, and the flourishing of Christ's church universal," Bishop Eaton said after the declaration was read. "This recommitment means working toward a deeper understanding of slavery and its legacy, of institutional and structural racism, of white privilege, and of attitudes and foundations of white supremacy. It means praying for the renewal of this church as disciples of the living Christ."

In reply, the Rev. Lamont Wells, president of the African Descent Lutheran Association, said, "We must abandon our lust for oppressive power, wealth and

even our own comfort for the sake of fulfilling God's fulfillment to love others. Throughout history, people have been hurt by this very particular sin. Therefore, we the people of African descent of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America can receive this apology as a divine mark of repentance that serves as a catalyst for change." Eaton said the ELCA will name an annual Day of Repentance for congregations, synods and the churchwide organization. These could be meaningless actions, unless they are embraced by congregations like ours who figure out how to live them, joining them with our prayers as we discern what God is offering us in these blessings to be lived out in our time and place.

Thank you for being brave with me as we discern our future together!


God's work. Our hands. Gathering, Word, Meal and Sending

Liturgy is important—not each constituent part—but the basic structure of corporate worship: gathering, word, meal and sending. It's a discipline Lutherans willingly undertake because it helps individuals and the entire community express our connection with other Christians throughout the world and across the ages.

When we gather, it's not simply a group of likeminded individuals. We gather in Jesus' name and we gather as the body of Christ. "So we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members one of another" (Romans 12:5).

The African concept of Ubuntu, "I am because we are," captures this. South African Archbishop Desmond Tutu explains it this way: "I need you in order for me to be me, and you need me in order for you to be you. We are bound together. I need other human beings to be a human being. A person is a person through other persons."

We gather in the presence of Jesus, God with us, in Whom we all have our ultimate identity.



worship God in the beauty of nature. I'm glad that people are moved to awe and praise when encountering the majesty of God in the created world. We all should stop and notice the divine presence! But corporate worship is something else. This was made beautifully evident to me when I visited the Community of Sant'Egidio in Rome.

This community of laypeople gathers regularly for Scripture reading, prayer, and to serve the poor and broken in the city around them. Sant'Egidio takes particular care of those who are mostly homebound during the week. Weekly worship with the rest of the community is a celebration for these people. They are reunited with the rest of the family—all gathered to worship the Lord. Their joy is palpable.

We gather around the word—Scripture, preaching, song, prayer and creeds, but especially around the living Word, Jesus Christ. We are not the focus of our worship—God is. Worship is not primarily about "me" or about "us." Worship is not a perfor-

mance for the community, but an offering directed to God. Jesus promised that when we gather in his name, he is in the midst of us. How would our worship change if we understood literally that Christ is present and we are offering Christ our worship and praise?

We gather for the meal. Gathered around our tables, we are gathered around the one table. We are fed and forgiven, reconciled and released, crucified and raised. In the words of institution, we hear the Jesus story—the story of Jesus, broken and shed, who gives himself completely for the life of the world. If your congregation uses the prayer that surrounds these words, you also hear the history of salvation. While each individual receives God in the sacraments, no individual receives this grace alone apart from the rest of the community.

We are sent. Gathered into one by the Spirit, carrying and bearing the word, never separated from the love of God in Christ Jesus, we are sent into the world. Some of the most important words spoken in the liturgy are "Go in peace. Serve the Lord." Out we go, serving this world God so loves. Jesus meets us there—in our struggles, joys, life and death. Then we gather again in worship to be strengthened and restored.

Peasants in France would take a loaf of bread with them into the fields. They would take a bite of bread, throw the loaf down the row, and begin the backbreaking work of hoeing and tending their crops. When they caught up to the bread, they took another bite and threw it down the row again. In this way they could keep on going. So it is with us as we receive the bread of life and serve the world.

HELPING GRAYS HARBOR'S AT-RISK YOUTH

The 1st Sunday of each month we highlight the needs of the at-risk youth in our communi-

ty. Our Caring Cupboard is a onestop donation site for the Gravity Center and other entities that serve Cupboard Grays Harbor Youth.

G.R.A.V.I.T.Y. Program

Typical Gravity Center kids are experiencing poverty and neglect. The kids are always hungry and can always use: Cup of Noodles, instant cocoa packets, bread, peanut butter and jelly, canned tuna, cookies and fruit. In addition the **teen parents** need: Diapers Size 1 or larger, baby wipes, soaps or lotions, clothes, bottles, Children's Tylenol, diaper rash creams. Will the church miss your giving when you are gone?

A couple of months ago I met with an elderly client to conduct a review. Let's call her "Ruth" for the purposes of this story. I knew Ruth was an active member of her church and I asked her "will your congregation miss your regular gifts after you are gone?" In other words, did her estate plan include any gifts to the church at her death?

Ruth's answer was "I've already taken care of that- my church is in my will for 10% of my estate."

When I heard that, I realized that she did not understand how her will worked in relation to her investment accounts

I told her, Ruth, currently all of your investment accounts have beneficiary designations that direct the proceeds to your two sons equally. Since you sold your home and moved into this continuing care community, now the only asset that will pass through your will is your bank account which has about \$4,000 in it. Ten percent of \$4,000 is \$400. That is what will go to the church at your death right now.

Ruth said, "Well, that's not what I want, I thought my will directed 10% of my estate to my church!" It is a common misunderstanding I said. Your will only directs those assets which do not have a beneficiary designation on them. (The exception is where your beneficiary is "my estate".) Right now your beneficiaries are your two sons and the only asset in your estate is your bank account.

It is not a difficult problem to fix, I said, we simply need to change the beneficiary designation on one of your accounts to send 10% of your estate to your church. Ruth asked me, "Does it matter which account is used?" I said yes it does, I suggest we change the beneficiary on an account that would ordinarily have taxable gain at your death. Ruth owned a large annuity with a lot of taxable gain. Ruth signed a new beneficiary form naming her church a primary beneficiary of a portion of that account that equaled 10% of her total estate. Her two sons split the balance remaining. By making the church the beneficiary of most of that account, no tax would be due on that portion of the annuity and the proceeds would pass tax free to the church.

Ruth's plan to leave 10% of her estate to the church was now in place and would now match her wishes.

Sadly, Ruth passed away just a couple of months after we made this change. Rather than leaving \$400 as her will required (10%) - by naming the church as a beneficiary to her annuity account, the church received \$40,000 - exactly as she intended.


