
We're part of a story as big as the cosmos and as personal as our own hearts; a story begun with God's uttering the words: Let there be... Let there be light, let there be rivers and oceans, skies and land and fill them all with creatures and plants: humans and beloved beings of all sorts. And God said, "It is good."

Our story envelops every moment of our days but

transcends the bounds of time. It began with a word and it is the Word that sustains us, ensures that the story we are inhabiting has God at its center, the God who is Alpha and Omega, the one who would let nothing separate humanity from God; the one who would fully enter into our humanity to live and die as one of us; the one who put an end to the power of death through suffering and dying as we do.

This is the story we are invited to live in every moment; a story that sets our hearts on fire when we are brave and vulnerable enough to show up, be fully present, and walk side by side with these beloved others God has given us to love even when we're unlovable; to serve with even when we don't always agree about what that means; to share all of life with even when it's messy and uncomfortable; even when we disappoint each other and ourselves. That's the life of REAL community that the Holy Spirit gathers, empowers, equips and sends. That's our life at Amazing Grace.

In this time of uncertainty in our world, you **are in**vited to become more deeply grounded in God's love through the story that is big enough to hold all of what makes you, you – all of your hopes and your



fears, your dreams and your nightmares. We become more deeply grounded through gathering regularly with this community to pray, to sing, to question and to think together about what it means to live God's radical love here and now. Grounding in God's story is defense against all the other stories that want your life, your energy and your hope. If regular gathering for you has been monthly in the past,

you are invited to double that to twice monthly and watch for ways that the Spirit will nurture you through that commitment to letting the Spirit work in your life.

You are invited to become more deeply grounded in God's love though learning our story in a deeper way by joining one of the small groups forming to study Manna and Mercy: A Brief History of God's Unfolding Promise to Mend the Entire Universe by Daniel Erlander beginning the week of Oct. 13th. Even though it's illustrated whimsically and may look childish, it's not! It's a faithful study of our Story – Genesis to Revelation that, reveals the Biblical God and so we must proceed with "fear and trembling" lest we rush in where angels dare not tread. Knowing the story that holds our own keeps us deeply grounded in healthy soil that can sustain us for a lifetime. This study is for all ages so Sunday School will be using this study as well. If there is not a group meeting at a time convenient for you, please talk with Pastor Val so we can figure out a different time.

You are invited to become more deeply grounded in God's love by deepening relationships with those God has given us to love; relationships that encourage honest conversation that springs from our willingness to be vulnerable. Notice all the opportunities at Amazing Grace for you to grow in relationship with this diverse group of people. If spending time with others is a stretch for you *(Introverts unite! ... Alone at home?)* consider staying for fellowship after worship once in a while; or sit with someone you barely know. Try attending a function you've never participated in before: a 4F dinner or quilters or maintenance crew or a book study group. We continue to look for ways we can grow in relationship through study, fun events and service. If you have an idea, please let me know.

God's Spirit continues to ground us in God's love for the sake of our living "full lives, full in the fullness of God" so that we can support each other in living those full lives and through that draw others into that same transformative love. The prospect of living truly full lives that require vulnerability and honesty can be terrifying. But we don't go alone. We take baby steps together, trusting that the Spirit is holding us, guiding us and will sustain us in our faithful efforts toward living the full life that is God's desire for us all. Amen

natural beauty, a sign of God's wonderful creativity, is defiled by pollutants and waste, resulting in ecological crisis. As a member church of The Lutheran World Federation, we affirm "that the global ecological crisis, including climate change is, human-induced. This is a spiritual matter. As people of faith, we are called to live in right relationship with creation and to not exhaust it." The effects of the warming climate are felt in

nearly every corner of the globe. These include increased migration, food insecurity due to changing agricultural landscapes, national security issues and health problems. As bad as it is for all creation, the most vulnerable people around the world are suffering the most. Yet they have contributed the least and, as noted in the United Nation's 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, are ill equipped to adapt to or mitigate the effects of a changing climate to build resilient communities.

An honest and credible look at the increasing environmental degradation and climate change names the neglect, carelessness and wrongs of industry, civil society and global governmental leadership. It also recognizes how human beings individually and collectively worsen the attacks on God's creation. As a church, we must confess our frequent lack of urgency in addressing environmental degradation and slow action to address a changing climate. We also must pledge to acknowledge the intersections of racial and environmental injustices and strive to involve the voices of those most affected in the process.

In grateful response to God's grace in Jesus Christ, this church carries out its responsibility for the wellbeing of society and the environment. Our "concern for the environment is shaped by the Word of God spoken in creation, the Love of God hanging on a cross, the Breath of God daily renewing the face of the earth." Our concern is, then, propelled by hope and guided by principles of justice. We find our hope in the promise of God's own faithfulness to everything God has made. We seek justice for all of creation in concert with God's creative and renewing power. We do so understanding that we have the ability and responsibility to act together for the common good, especially for those who are most vulnerable to the effects of climate change. As presiding bishop, I give thanks for all the ways this church embraces our common responsibility to care for all of God's creation. I call on us as individuals and congregations to continue efforts through stewardship, education and advocacy. I am reminded of the 2016 Churchwide Assembly resolution "Towards a Responsible Energy Future," among others, that urges members of the ELCA and its related institutions to exemplify personal and institutional responsibility. Such efforts could include practicing energy conservation, congregational energy audits, purchasing more energy efficient appliances and vehicles, and investing in renewable energy systems. These resolutions also urge advocating at all levels of government for public policies that support clean, renewable energy sources.

The present moment is a critical and urgent one, filled with both challenge and opportunity to act as individuals, citizens, leaders and communities of faith in solidarity with God's good creation and in hope for our shared future. We claim God's promise in Revelation 21 for "a new heaven and a new earth" as we pray together:

"Almighty God, in giving us dominion over things on earth, you made us coworkers in your creation. Give us wisdom and reverence to use the resources of nature so that no one may suffer from our abuse of them, and that generations yet to come may continue to praise you for your bounty; through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. 
EXPLORATORY INTERNSHIP TEAM
