Can't have one without the other. Death and birth are bound inextricably in the cycles of creation. As one year ends a new one begins so quickly it takes my breath away. There's hardly time to mourn the loss before celebrating the promise of what's to come.

As I write this the drums of war are beating, fires in Australia are burning out of con-

trol giving us a foretaste of what climate change may soon hold for the rest of us, and integrity and truth are under assault in many areas of our life together.

As I write this my daughter and 5-month-old granddaughter call to video chat, just because they want to see me and for a few minutes my world and my heart are full of tenderness and hope.

This new year and new decade (depending on how you count that start point) promise to be full of change, upheaval, uncertainty – all those things we humans dearly love (note: extreme sarcasm!)

Many things are out of our control and influence. How we react to those things and to the moments of sublime beauty and joy are within our control. Even the bitterest moment can be held in gratitude. Even the most profound joy can be soured by resentment.

It is not a trite sentiment to say that the answer to all things, good and bad, is prayer. As Father Richard Rohr has said, "Prayer is sitting in the silence until it silences us, choosing gratitude until we are grateful, and praising God until we ourselves are an act of praise. Mature prayer always breaks into gratitude."

This is not an escape from the world. It is deep immersion in the heart of God that prepares us to engage all that the world throws at us from God's perspective of love.

Brian D. McLaren writes about Christianity becoming "a movement of revolutionary love." He writes, "The most important aspect of Christianity in the future is simple, obvious, and yet radical: it is about love, as Jesus taught and embodied.... In this desira-

OF GRAYS HARBOR ble future, every willing Christian congregation makes every competing interest subsidiary to love, which is the fruit of all contemplation and the goal of all action. If we embody this form of Christianity, if we become the seeds of a movement of contemplative activism in the Spirit of Christ, I can imagine hundreds of thousands of congregations, each a locally and globally engaged school of love,

teaching future generations to discover, practice, and live in love: love for our neighbor, love for ourselves, love for all creatures and all creation—all comprising love for God, who is all in all in all."

Perhaps we, as Christ's body at Amazing Grace in Aberdeen, WA in the year 2020 can ask no better question as a way to bring stability and hope to our future than "How can we become more and more a "school of love" for each other, for our local community and for the world?

One form of prayer that prepares us for engagement in the world is the Examen, an ancient spiritual practice still used by many today who seek to draw closer to God's heart. I offer the following form of the Examen as a way to pray our endings and prepare for the new beginnings and opportunities that await us to be students in this "school of love."

We remember where we may have experienced God in the days of the past year and, conversely, where we might have missed God. It is asking for God's eyes and heart in order to see well our journey with Christ. You should take some time with this, at least an hour in a quiet place alone. But, if that's not possible, do what you can. It is enough to place yourself before God with the desire to be led by the Spirit.

Begin: Take deep breaths. Let yourself settle and relax. Release any need to perform or feeling of expectation. Know that whatever happens in this time, it is enough. Pray a simple prayer that acknowledges God's presence with you and around you.

Receive: Ask God for the ability to move beyond your perspective of yourself and your year. Out beyond your accomplishments and your failings is a

spacious place where God wants to take you. Invite the Holy Spirit to reveal what God would have you focus on, whether it is the sweep of the whole year or one or two specific experiences within it.

Ask: If you feel led (and only if), use a few questions for guidance: In the past year, where or for what do I find myself the most thankful? An event? An experience I had? The love I received from others? Courageous action that I took?

Spend some time asking for God's light to reveal Godself to me, and for God to reveal myself to me. Where have I felt deep joy (even if fleetingly)? What has be unsettling or upsetting? What has been a struggle or challenge? Where did I experience stopping and resting?

Review: Allow the past year to play before you like a movie. Let God control the timing and scenes. What would the Spirit like to show you? Release your agendas, and notice what Christ wants you to pay attention to.

Pray: Using the questions or images as the ground of your prayer, come to God in conversation or silence. This may be a particular event or it may be a pattern you have noticed emerging. Spend time with this before God. You may want to journal, or create, or do something else that is a natural ground for

communication with God. If you chose a word for 2019, pray that to God. Does the Spirit have a word for 2019 in retrospect that may be different than the word you chose moving forward? You will receive a Star Word in worship on Sunday, 1/5. Maybe that is the word that can guide you in 2020.

Imagine: If it feels right, ask God to give you a holy imagining for 2020. Are there blessings or challenges ahead? Relationships, habits, learnings that you are being invited into or out of? Imagine what it might be like to experience those things with God, rather than on your own. Notice what Christ has to say to you about these things. Are there graces God is inviting you to ask for even now?

Rest: After you are done, spend some time simply resting in silence with God. Allow your heart to be held by the One who loves you most. Release all you can into God's care, and enjoy God's delight in you, the Beloved.

Whatever the future holds, we are held in God's love. God is with us, Emmanuel. Because God is not with ME, but us, there is hope - we are in this together through thick and thin, joy and despair. We are not alone because God is with us and we are with each other! Thanks be to God!

Dear Friends in Christ,

As I write this newsletter, it is mid-December and I am primarily thinking about the approach of Christmas and the celebration of the birth of Christ. However, this is the January newsletter, which also leads me to think about the New Year.

Where are they connected? Christ's birth... Epiphany...New Year. They all seem to be connected to the hope and new life that God stirs up in us.

When our family gathers with friends and

relatives at this time of year, we like to ask each other the question, "What are you hoping for in the New Year?" On the one hand, it is a chance to talk about specific plans that have been made, such as an up-coming trip or a project that will be started. Yet, it is also a chance to talk about the deeper dreams and hopes of our hearts. "I hope for an end to violence in our country and the world." "I hope for meaning and satisfaction in my work." And bring us at last into glory. (Marty Haugen)




