Longing for light, we wait in darkness

The darkness of January in western Washington is a fact of life. It rains here. Sometimes it rains a lot, day after day, after day, after day ...

And it's dark when it rains. We know rain is lifegiving. It is necessary. It prevents forest fires and keeps the rivers and streams healthy. But, it's dark. And the dark can feel heavy and endless.

But, it's not just the literal darkness of these midwinter days that make us long for light. We feel the weight of the darkness of conflict, of violence; the darkness we feel watching life get even harder for the poor, the marginalized and those without voice. We feel the darkness of our own hearts weighed down by the need of the world so oppressive that we turn away. We turn away from the news, from each other. Turning even away from acknowledging our own feelings.

It was into this darkness that I was reminded of Valarie Kaur's challenge to ask when faced with the darkness of our world's suffering, "What if this darkness is not the darkness of the tomb, but the darkness of the womb?" Valarie Kaur, a Sikh American civil rights activist and lawyer knows the darkness of suffering and offers us not a way out but a way through. When we feel as if everything is becoming too much to bear, she challenges us not to hide which, in reality is impossible. She challenges us to breathe and to push through the suffering, through the pain of disillusionment, through the broken hopes and dreams. Push into a future that we can birth together.

And that's why, at least in part, the church in its wisdom recognized the need for a season of light. Because the darkness is not just this month or this year and it's not just in this place, obviously. Darkness comes to the world at times as war, racism, hatred of the other in all its forms. But, it also comes in illness, and loneliness, death and betrayal, and in so many other ways. To everyone. Everywhere.

Into that darkness, Epiphany takes us by the hand and walks us, like a good friend from the mystery of the Christmas manger into the womb of the cross that transforms all suffering into new life, new possibility, a NEW CREATION.



We're not powerless and we're not alone. We have each other and we have God's Spirit transforming this darkness into light; this isolation into community; this suffering into new life.

Longing for truth, we turn to You and pray Make us Your own, Your holy people Light for the world to see.

Christ, be our light!
Shine in our hearts.
Shine through the darkness.
Christ, be our light!
Shine in Your church gathered today.

Longing for peace, our world is troubled Longing for hope, many despair. Your word alone has pow'r to save us. Make us your living voice.

Longing for food, many are hungry Longing for water, many still thirst. Make us Your bread, broken for others Shared until all are fed. Christ be our light.

ELCA presiding bishop issues response to President Trump's "Peace to Prosperity" document

"Pray for the peace of Jerusalem" (Psalm 122:6)

I am very dismayed and disturbed by President Trump's announcement of a "peace plan" that, I fear, will bring greater insecurity for Israelis and Palestinians instead of peace.

Our church has long held that any successful settlement of the Israeli-Palestinian conflict must be based on negotiation between the parties. Unfortunately, this "plan" has involved only one party. A plan made for a people without consulting that people will not bring peace. It also seeks to remove from the table many of the final status issues by effectively giving a green light to Israel to further entrench the occupation, rather than end it, a policy we have advocated for years.

Rather than drawing together Israelis and Palestinians to reach a peace accord, the effect of this plan will be further alienation and, I am afraid, more tension, with the possibility of new, violent responses. This path will not lead to peace with justice. It will not promote reconciliation. But it will reinforce extremists in Israel, in Palestine and throughout the region, decreasing security for everyone.

Just last week, United Nations Under-

Secretary-General for Political and Peacebuilding Affairs Rosemary DiCarlo briefed the Security Council, noting:

"It is sadly not a surprise that a recent survey of millennials by the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) found that almost two-thirds (65 per cent) of Israeli millennials thought the Israeli-Palestinian conflict would "never end", making them the least optimistic of the people surveyed in countries affected by war. Palestinians were also pessimistic, although slightly less so, with 52 per cent believing that the conflict would never end.

"The international community bears a responsibility to help build a different future for these young Israelis and Palestinians, one that promises hope, reconciliation and peaceful coexistence rather than perpetual occupation and conflict."

She closed by saying she "would like to emphasize the continued urgency of resolving the Palestinian-Israeli conflict on the basis of relevant UN resolutions, international law and bilateral agreements."

Therefore, I call upon President Trump to develop a different plan that would involve all parties, and to pursue efforts that would adhere to international law and human rights conventions. This plan should ensure the protection and preservation of internationally recognized human rights and realize, for Palestinians and for Israelis, two viable, secure states living side by side in peace.




